Ellen L. Clark Dies Suddenly

"Tonopah, June 23. (Special) — Mrs. Ellen Lenora Clark, popular Tonopah matron, died a few hours after she had undergone a major operation Thursday evening. The operation was performed in the morning and she was apparently recovering when a blood clot formed and despite all medical assistance, she died about 11 o'clock.

Mrs. Clark was born in Virginia City, Nevada, October 11, 1896. Her early life was spent on the Cornstock and in 1913 she accompanied her parents to Tonopah where she had since resided. She attended Virginia City schools and was a graduate of the University of Nevada with the class of 1913.

With the completion of her education, she accepted a position as a member of the faculty of the Tonopah grade school and continued in this vocation until July 19, 1933, when she was married to William Roy Clark, local mining man.
