Michael Craney died at 12:30 Monday night in a tucker tent on North Main street of tuberculosis, aged about thirty-one years. He came down here a few weeks ago in the hope of benefiting his health but gradually declined until the end came. W.N. Mack nursed him during his last illness. About midnight the sick man tried to get out of bed, saying he was going "up there" to sleep and in a few minutes he had gone "up there" for the long sleep that knows no walking on earth. His parents live in Butte, Mont., and a sad feature of the case is that he has a wife in Republic, Wash., who is about to become a monther. Mr. Craney was an Eagle and members of that society have been caring for him.
