
RESIDENT OF IONE DIES OF WOUNDS AFTER SLAYING INDIAN

TONOPAH, Nev., Dec. 9—(Special).
—Al Tilton, sixty years of age and resident of Nye county for twenty-five years, died at Ione Tuesday night as a result of a gunshot wound received following an altercation at the Ione Indian camp, during which Tilton shot and killed Dude Abe, nineteen-year-old Indian boy.

Appearing at the store of S Lampa in Ione early Tuesday evening, Tilton advised Lampa that he had had trouble with the Indians, accusing them of having made a theft from his liquor supply, and that he had shot the boy, Abe. He requested Lampa to notify the authorities at Tonopah. Following this Tilton went to the home of Oscar Hufferd, apparently to await the arrival of officers. Shortly after entering the Hufferd house he was fatally wounded by the discharge of a shotgun fired through a window by an unknown hand.

Two Indian boys of the Ione camp, Willie Dick and Bob Jackson, each about nineteen years of age, arrested on suspicion and brought to Tonopah by Sheriff W. H. Thomas Thursday, are awaiting a hearing.

An inquest was held at Ione Thursday and the body of Tilton buried at Ione. The body of the Indian boy was removed to Smokey valley for burial by relatives there. Tilton is said to have relatives in the East.
